- False claims of so-called CRT and pornography riddling the district.

We sincerely hope that the Board considers the following factors when voting on Dr. Ebert's contract renewal:

If Dr. Ebert is willfully removed by the Board, many teachers will leave the district.

- Parents will likely pull their kids out of the district in favor of other districts with more experienced teachers, and where they don't have to constantly have to fight off a political extremist group like the TCC.

1.

Request for a Policy violation

As a community, we request that all discussions regarding Dr. Ebert's contract are to be held in open session. We deserve to be aware of the exact reason why the Board would consider the most major contract maneuver the district can possibly make. The community deserves to know why such a major change would be considered.

We request an extended community feedback period at the January 4th board meeting, consisting of two separate sections. There is precedent for this meeting structure as recently as the August curriculum approval meeting and we are asking for the same chance at community feedback and consideration for such an important decision that affects so many.
